

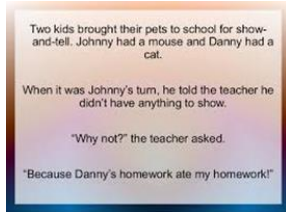


Hello everybody in Rang 1.
