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Subject	Topic	Activities
English	The Airport	Oral Language: The Airport - Starlight Junior Infants, go to www.folensonline.ie/registration register as a teacher using Prim20 as the roll number to access resources. Click on 'Unit', then choose number 16 - The Airport. Unfortunately, we will not be seeing the airport in real life this summer but it is a good opportunity to set up an airport role play area at home using cardboard boxes and junk materials to make resources for it. 1. Scroll down to 'poster'. Listen to 'story 2' asking as many questions to illicit understanding and further discussion. 2. Label the poster by matching the words to the poster. 3. Read the poem together (Taking Off by Mary McB Green) with your child and after they are familiar with it, get them to say the end of the sentences that rhyme. Can any of the words be replaced with other rhyming words to make sense? 4. Carry out the 'activity' of answering the questions about things we would pack to go on holiday. 5. Answer the questions about the poster. Try to give full sentences as your answer rather than just word.
		 Phonics: Use the activities inside the inside cover of your child's sound copy to revise and reinforce phonics sounds. Use flashcards to practise sounds and actions. Just Phonics class book- complete page 75 to 80 - page 79 to be completed independently by your child Use the Jolly Phonics app

Reading: Starlight Junior Infants- Core Reader 4- A Camping Trip

- Core Reader 4 A Camping Trip and all words (decodable and sight words).
- Before reading, talk about the fact that this is an information book.
- Use the 'before', 'during' and 'after' reading suggestions on the inside cover of core reader 4.
- Words; camping, trip, bring, sleeping bag, tent, red, in, having, van, ice-pops, swimming pool, best, enormous, cool and sight words; that, there, some, like
- Use the digital flashcards online for practice.
- Oxford Reading Tree is a fantastic free website with books to read over the summer based on your child's reading ability.
- Children to find words in their readers and place their flashcards on top of the corresponding one.
- Identify and read sounds and sight words by using some fun ideas as in the pictures below! Anything that makes learning fun will be engaging and productive.

Maths	Mental and Practical Maths	These activities could be carried out periodically over the summer holidays for revision. Count on from 0 and back from 10. Count on from a given number- you say 5 and your child continues on until 10. What is one more than _? / What is one less than _? Rhythm counting- clap hands and slap knees while counting. Counting stick- I have one of these in school and the children love the challenges. It is just the handle of a sweeping brush/mop marked out with masking tape in ten even intervals. Sometimes, it helps if the middle one is a different colour. Count from 0 to 10 on the counting stick then skip one or two and children must work out what number you are pointing to. Point to an interval, what is two more than this number? This activity makes them familiar with the number line and helps with their problem solving skills. Some children in Junior Infants were also able to use the counting stick to count in 2s

		to 20. So then the middle interval would be 10 instead of 5. The sound of a number. Children love this activity in school too. Children close their eyes and listen. Using a tin can or any other container that makes noise, drop cubes/stones into the container. I tell children that they can use their fingers to keep track of how many cubes are dropped into the can. How many cubes are in the can? Empty the can and count the cubes together. After you've done this a few times, make up a silly sound that means you are taking a cube out of the can. How many cubes are in the can now? As you are walking, count forwards or backwards with each step. Now hop each time you say a number. Complete Chapter 19 Comparing and Ordering 2 (page 92) and Chapter 21 Partitioning (page 98).
